New virtual care program expands at-home heart failure support

Announcing the **American Heart Association Connected Care™, Powered by Cadence**, a remote patient monitoring program designed to close critical gaps in heart failure care by extending support into patients' homes after hospital discharge.

- Nearly 1 in 4 heart failure patients are readmitted to the hospital within 30 days. American Heart Association Connected Care, Powered by Cadence helps reduce readmissions by combining advanced remote patient monitoring with guideline-directed therapy and 24/7 virtual provider support.
- Patients are enrolled before hospital discharge and receive training, device monitoring and ongoing clinical support from Cadence's care team.
- The Association spearheaded this collaboration with Cadence to extend the reach of our trusted science into homes and communities using Cadence's remote platform and 24/7 virtual provider team.

The new 2025 AHA/ACC guideline highlights lifestyle changes, early treatment, use of the PREVENT™ risk calculator for personalized care, and blood pressure management across pregnancy to prevent and treat high blood pressure and reduce dementia risk.

The new AHA/ACC guidelines recommend healthy lifestyle changes and, when needed, early medication to manage high blood pressure and lower the risk of cardiovascular disease, kidney disease, cognitive decline and dementia.
